Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Statement containing Financial Results of **Cello Consumer Products Private Limited**("the Company") for the period ended August 21, to March 31, 2025" ("Statement") and (refer paragraph of 'Other Matters' section below), which were subject to limited review by us, both included in the accompanying "Statement of Financial Results for the period ended August 21, to March 31, 2025" of **Cello Consumer Products Private Limited** ("the Company"), ("the Statement"). The Statement has been prepared for the submission to Cello World Limited ("the Parent Company), to enable it to prepare the consolidated financial results.

(a) Opinion on Annual Financial Results

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the Annual Financial Results for the period ended August 21, to March 31, 2025:

- ii. gives a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the Indian Accounting Standards and other accounting principles generally accepted in India of the net profit and total comprehensive income and other financial information of the Company for the period then ended.

(b) Conclusion on Financial Results for the quarter ended March 31,2025

This responsibility includes the preparation and presentation of the Financial Results for the period ended August 21, to March 31, 2025 that give a true and fair view of the net profit and other comprehensive income and other financial information in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the Indian Accounting Standards prescribed under Section 133 of the Act read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulations 33 of the Listing Regulations, to enable the Parent Company to prepare its consolidated financial results. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and the design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the Statement that give a true and fair view and is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error

A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with SAs specified under section 143(10) of the Act and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Other Matter

The accompanying Statement includes the results for the quarter ended March 31, 2025 being the balancing figure between audited figures in respect of the period August 21,2024 to March 31,2025 and published figures for the Period August 21, 2024 to December 31,2024 of the current financial year. which were subject to limited review by us, as required under the Listing Regulations.

Our opinion on the Audit of the Financial Results for the period ended August 21, 2024 to March 31, 2025 is not modified in respect of this matter.
